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INTRODUCTION



MONDAY. DECEMBER 1ST

GRACIOUS & GOOD TO ALL

MONDAY. DECEMBER 8ND

PROMISE KEEPER FOR ALL

"The Lord had said to Abram, 'Go from your country, your people and your father's household to the land I will show you. I will make you into a great nation, and I will bless you; I will make your name great, and you will be a blessing. I will bless those who bless you, and whoever curses you I will curse; and all peoples on earth will be blessed through you."

Genesis 12:1-3

Recently, I had the opportunity to teach a Kidz Church lesson about the connection between the Old and New Testaments. I love a good visual, so I illustrated by making two paper chains: green for the Old Testament and red for the New. I joined them using a single golden link with a big bold word on it: JESUS.

You see, when God made that promise to Abraham to bless all nations through him, God already had his perfect plan for redemption in motion. That promise pointed to a Messiah who would come through Abraham's family line, and through the prophets he revealed that they would come from the house of David. TUESDAY. DECEMBER 9TH

HE BLESSES OBEDIENCE

THURSDAY. DECEMBER 11TH

BETHLEHEM FORETOLD

"But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, though you are small among the clans of Judah, out of you will come for me one who will be ruler over Israel, whose origins are from of old, from ancient times.""

Micah 5:2

Centuries before the birth of Jesus, the prophet Micah delivered a message of hope to a people longing for deliverance. Micah 5:2 points to Bethlehem, a seemingly insignificant village, as the birthplace of the one who would change the course of history. In the world's eyes, power and greatness are often associated with prominence, wealth, or influence. Yet, God chose humility and obscurity as the setting for His greatest gift to humanity.

Consider the striking contrast: Bethlehem was "small among the clans of Judah," yet from it would come a ruler whose "origins are from of old, from ancient times." This prophecy not only affirms the divinity of Christ, but also reminds us that God's plans are not constrained by human expectations or limitations.

Take time today to reflect on areas of your life where you feel "small" or insignificant. Ask God to show you how He might use those very places for His purposes. Remember, Bethlehem was overlooked by many, but chosen by God.

HE LOVED SO HE GAVE

"For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life."

John 3:16

n this scripture, we often fixate on the words loved, Son, and eternal life. But notice the verb that tells us something profound about God's character: He gave.

God is, at His core, a generous giver. He does not give reluctantly. He does not give sparingly. He does not give out of obligation or duty. He gives out of abundance because it is His nature to pour Himself out for those He loves. The Father's giving is not a reaction to our works or goodness, but an expression of His. The ultimate gift God gave us was not an object, a blessing, a provision, or a spiritual perk. He gave HIMSELF, through His Son.

We often give to fill a need when someone is hungry, hurting, or in trouble. We typically give from our excess, but God gave from His essence. He gave His one and only Son the treasure of heaven, the delight of eternity. This gift wasn't wrapped in glory but in humility. This gift was not set up on a throne but hung on a cross for a purpose: to ensure our life instead of death, hope instead of despair, freedom instead of fear, and eternity instead of judgment to all who accept this Gift and believe in Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior. A gift must be received to be enjoyed. John 3:16 includes an open invitation: "Whoever believes..." That means you aren't disqualified. You aren't overlooked. You aren't too late. God's Gift only needs your willing heart to receive it! What He gave in Christ is proof that He will not stop giving you the grace, strength, wisdom, peace, and comfort you need each day.
